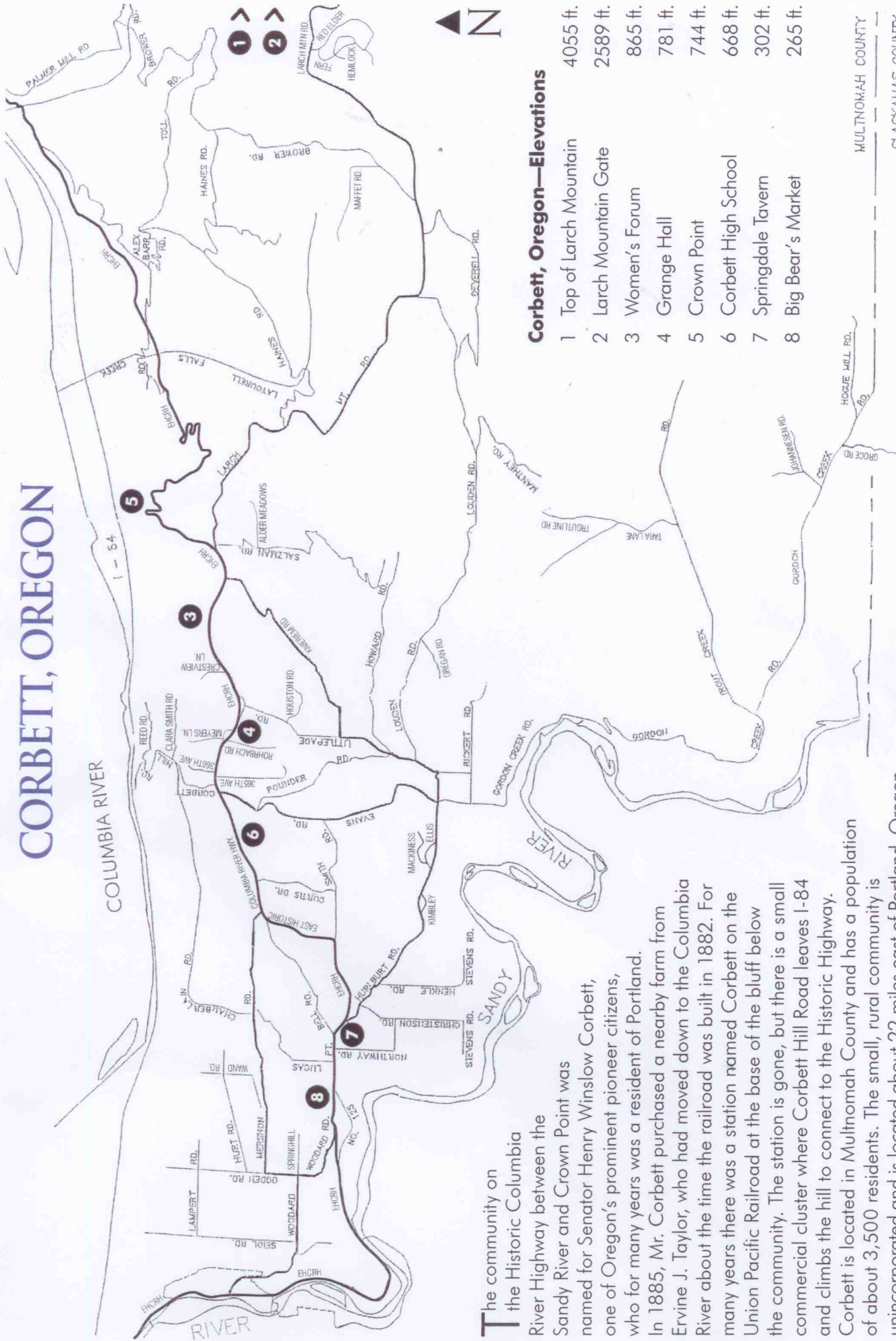


CORBETT, OREGON



The community on the Historic Columbia River Highway between the Sandy River and Crown Point was named for Senator Henry Winslow Corbett, one of Oregon's prominent pioneer citizens, who for many years was a resident of Portland. In 1885, Mr. Corbett purchased a nearby farm from Irvine J. Taylor, who had moved down to the Columbia River about the time the railroad was built in 1882. For many years there was a station named Corbett on the Union Pacific Railroad at the base of the bluff below the community. The station is gone, but there is a small commercial cluster where Corbett Hill Road leaves I-84 and climbs the hill to connect to the Historic Highway. Corbett is located in Multnomah County and has a population of about 3,500 residents. The small, rural community is unincorporated and is located about 22 miles east of Portland, Oregon.
