## **CP Supplemental Training**

In addition to completing the initial Citizen Patrol (CP) training program, members are highly encouraged enroll in free, continuing education classes. Nearly all of the classes listed below can be taken free and online. CP members will accrue volunteer "hours" for each class/certificate achieved. CP members are asked to volunteer 6-hours per month to remain active. Completing these classes are a good way to earn your monthly hours despite being unable to attend a monthly CP training, patrol or other activity. If you earn a completion certificate, please forward the copy to the CP Liaison Deputy. These classes are meant to supplement, not replace, the monthly CP trainings.
